MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION OF FUND PERFORMANCE

This interim management report of fund performance presents management's view of the significant factors and developments during the period that have affected the fund's performance and outlook. In this report, "Matco" refers to Matco Financial Inc., the Manager of the Fund.

Investment Objective and Strategies

The objective of the Matco Fixed Income Fund (the "Fund") is to provide an optimal level of income with some potential for capital appreciation while preserving capital by investing primarily in Canadian dollar-denominated investment grade debt instruments. These securities will consist of bonds and debentures and may also include real return bonds, mortgage-backed securities and assetbacked securities. The debt obligations will be issued or guaranteed by, Canadian federal, provincial or municipal governments, Canadian chartered banks, Canadian loan or trust companies or Canadian corporations.

Within the context of optimal income, the Fund may also invest in income generating common and preferred equities, as well as foreign currency denominated fixed income instruments from Canadian or foreign issuers.

To balance current income and long-term capital appreciation, the Fund may invest in Canadian dividend-paying equities and investment grade fixed income assets. The portfolio is diversified across market capitalization, asset classes, sectors and geographic regions. This "one-stop" Fund offers diversified sources of ongoing income, preserves capital based on an institutional investment risk management process and provides lower volatility performance.

Risk

The overall and specific risks of investing in the Fund are as described in the Fund's Simplified Prospectus dated June 11, 2021. There were no material changes to the Fund during the period that affected the overall level of risk associated with an investment in the Fund.

Results of Operations

The Fund's net assets decreased to \$106.2 million at June 30, 2021 from \$112.3 million at December 31, 2020. Total investment loss for the period ended June 30, 2021 was \$3.7 million, prior to other income and operating expenses, down from \$9.0 million for the period ended June 30, 2020.

The Canadian bond market was relatively subdued throughout the second quarter, with credit spreads continuing to grind modestly lower while shorter-term interest rates trended sideways and longer-term interest rates drifted lower. The Fund's performance continues to benefit from its overweight in the corporate sector, while the longer-term bond holdings produced positive returns due to interest rates moving lower. The fund also benefited from its 10% exposure to preferred shares, which returned approximately 2.7% in the second quarter. In combination, these factors allowed the Fund to perform relatively in line with its benchmark. Overall, the fund's positioning continues to focus on protecting against the negative impact of rising interest rates while maintaining a healthy portfolio vield.

The Fund added 5 preferred share holdings for a total position of approximately 10%. These preferred shares are structured in staggered terms, laddered with reset dates from 2023 to 2025. These holdings are designed to protect the fund from rising 5-year interest rates while generating income in the meantime. The Fund also increased its exposure to floating rate notes by approximately 11.5%. These floating rate notes should protect the fund from rising short term interest rates. The adjustments lowered the duration of the Fund by 0.70 years while increasing the portfolio's yield by 0.36%. The Fund's corporate bond holdings remain in healthy standing and no adjustments were made to those particular holdings.

Recent Developments

North American central banks, the Bank of Canada and the U.S. Federal Reserve have laid out their intentions for the next 24 months. They have explicitly indicated that they intend to leave their overnight interest rates at the current levels of 0.25%, until 2023. These communications are intended to provide capital markets with the certainty that low interest rates will continue to support the economic recovery. Taking it a step further, both central banks are in the process of purchasing securities in the open market, namely government and corporate bonds. This action will also serve as a line of support for both the economy and markets. As we approach the end of 2021, both central banks are likely to begin paring back the amount of bonds they are buying in the market. This particular action is referred to as "tapering their asset purchase". When the tapering begins, it will be a very modest and measured approach so as not to disrupt credit markets in the process. Lastly, the U.S. Federal Reserve has indicated that they will be targeting long-term average inflation going forward, as opposed to simply targeting 2% inflation at a point in time. What does this all mean for the bond market? The implications are three-fold. First and foremost, one should anticipate short term interest rates to remain low through 2021. Secondly, although corporate bond spreads have recovered significantly, they should remain relatively stable given that central banks are directly supporting them through their purchase of corporate bonds in the open market. Thirdly, with central banks now focusing on long-term average inflation, longer-term interest rates are likely to drift higher even though short-term interest rates may remain stable; this trend has already begun to unfold. Overall, this lends to a stable but modest return outlook for the fixed income market in Canada. Within our Matco Fixed Income Fund, we continue to adjust our portfolio positioning to maintain a healthy level of income while avoiding unnecessary risk.

Related Party Transactions

Management Fees

Matco provides the Fund with investment management services, including managing the investment portfolio, providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions, making brokerage arrangements for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio and providing other services. In return, Matco receives a management fee based on the net assets of the Fund, calculated on a daily basis.

For the period ended June 30, 2021, the Fund incurred management fees payable to Matco of \$6,161 (period ended June 30, 2020 - \$6,928). Matco, at its discretion, absorbed \$625 (period ended June 30, 2020 - \$nil) of expenses for the period ended June 30, 2021. There is no obligation nor guarantee that the Manager will continue to absorb expenses in future periods.

Investment Review Committee

An Investment Review Committee ("IRC") has been established by the Manager in accordance with National Instrument 81-107 Independent Review Committee for Investment Funds ("NI 81-107"). The IRC must review and approve conflict of interest matters as referred by the Manager. The Fund did not refer any related party transactions or conflict of interest matters to the IRC during the period ended June 30, 2021 or year ended December 31, 2020.

- (4) The information is prepared in accordance with IFRS which uses the last trade price for investments that are traded in an active market where quoted prices are readily and regularly available. For investments that are not traded in an active market, the Fund uses valuation techniques that maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.
- (5) This information is provided as at and for the year shown, as applicable, except June 30, 2021 which is for the six months then ended. Series N results for 2018 are from inception February 6, 2018 through December 31, 2018.
- (6) Management expense ratio is based on total expenses for the stated period and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the year/period.
- (7) The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio advisor manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher a fund's portfolio turnover rate in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by the fund in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the period. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund.
- (8) The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net assets during the year/ period.

Management Fees

The annual management fee rates, exclusive of sales taxes, are 1.20%, 0.70% and 0.35% for Series A, F and N respectively. No management fees are charged directly to Series O.

During the period ended June 30, 2021, management fees totaled \$6,161 (period ended June 30, 2020 - \$6,928). Included in liabilities at June 30, 2021 is \$1,049 (December 31, 2020 - \$1,101) in respect of these fees.

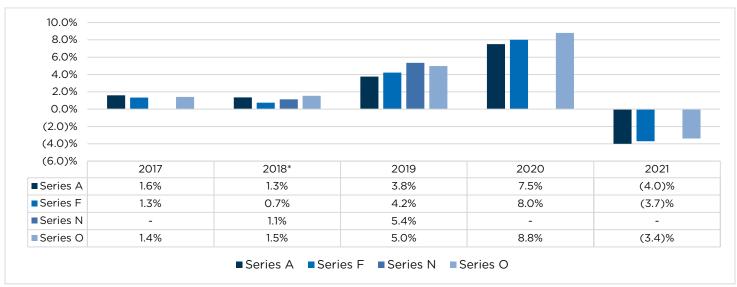
All management fees paid by Series F and N were applied to cover portfolio management and other services provided to the Fund by the Manager. No such fees were used to pay for external portfolio advisory fees, trailing or other sales commissions. Of management fees paid on Series A, 41.67% were used to pay for trailing and other dealer sales commissions, the remaining 58.33% covered portfolio management and other services provided to the Fund by the Manager.
